# The Branches of Government at Work: Primary Source Exploration TEACHER INSTRUCTIONS

#### **Benchmark**

SS.7.C.3.8: Analyze the structure, functions, and processes of the legislative, executive, and judicial branches.

#### **Activity**

Students will analyze primary sources from the Civil Rights Movement and the *Brown v. Board* of *Education* Supreme Court decision. Students will need to decide which branch of government is at work in each image.

#### **Materials**

- \* The Branches of Government at Work Slideshow
- \* Primary Source Images, printed and posted around the classroom
- \* Graphic Organizer
- Teacher Answer Key

#### Instructions

- 1. Use the Branches of Government at Work Slideshow to print the six primary source images and captions. Post the images at six different areas around the room. Next to the image, fold the caption in half and place it next to the image. Students will need to view the caption after they have analyzed the image.
- 2. Provide students with the graphic organizers, either digitally or on paper.
- 3. Place students into groups of 2 or 3 and move each group to one of the image stations around the classroom.
- 4. Provide students 6-7 minutes to work at each station.
- 5. Instruct students to work in their group to discuss and analyze the images together. Have students answer the questions on the graphic organizer. If needed, instruct students to annotate the picture before filling out the graphic organizer. At the end of each round, have students unfold and read the caption, so students can compare their predictions to the captions.
- 6. Allow students time to correct their answers, if necessary. Especially, which branch of government is working in the picture.
- 7. Instruct students to refold the caption.
- 8. Have students rotate to the next station.
- 9. Repeat steps 1-8, until all students have been to all 6 stations.
