SS.7.C.3.6 Benchmark Clarification 4: Students will evaluate the impact of the government upholding and/or restricting individual constitutional rights.

The **Founding Fathers** knew that the needs of the public could change over time. In the Constitution, they gave the government the ability to either protect or limit **individual rights**. The government's job is to protect both the Constitution and the **public interest**.

Some people are concerned that protecting the public interest too much may hurt individual rights. Others are concerned that protecting individual rights too much may hurt the public interest.

<u>Founding Fathers</u> - representatives from each of the 13 colonies who participated in writing the Declaration of Independence and the US Constitution

individual rights - rights guaranteed or belonging to a person

public interest - common benefit, the general benefit of the public
