

Federalism: Federal vs. State Power Gallery Walk

TEACHER INSTRUCTIONS

Benchmark

SS.7.C.3.4: Identify the relationship and division of powers between the federal government and state governments.

Activity

Students will review the concepts of enumerated, reserved and concurrent powers. They will apply their understanding to a gallery walk and analyze images related to these powers.

Materials

- * Gallery Walk <u>Slideshow</u> with Federalism Images print 1 copy of each slide to post around the classroom, creating Gallery Walk stations.
- * Warm Up Questions
- Gallery Walk Graphic Organizer
 - Standard (Page 3) or Scaffolded (Page 4) versions available
- * Timer
- * Music optional

Instructions

- 1. Print and post each Gallery Walk slide and place them around the classroom.
- 2. Review the Warm-Up Questions as a whole class or have students complete them independently as bell work.
 - a. What is an enumerated power?
 - b. What is a reserved power?
 - c. What is a concurrent power?
 - d. Why does our Constitution create these different types of powers? Why is this separation important?
- 3. Pass out the Gallery Walk Graphic Organizer, 1 per student. Review the graphic organizer as a whole class.
- 4. Place students into small groups of 2-3 and have each group move to one of the stations.
- 5. Instruct students to work as a group to complete the graphic organizer row for that image. Provide students 5-6 minutes to complete this task.
- 6. Rotate so that every group visits every station using a timer. Or, as an alternative, allow groups to move to each station at their own pace.
