

Political Parties Major Political Parties Corners Activity

TEACHER INSTRUCTIONS

Benchmark

SS.7.C.2.8: Identify America's current political parties, and illustrate their ideas about government.

Activity

Students will complete a corners activity to demonstrate their knowledge of Democratic and Republican political party beliefs. Students will listen to statements about common political party beliefs and they will determine whether each statement more closely aligns with the Democratic Party or the Republican Party. Students will complete an exit slip for assessment of their understanding of the benchmark.

Materials

- * Political Party Belief Statements Google Slides
- * Political Party Corners Activity Exit Slip, page 2 one per student
 - Optional Student Scaffolded Version, page 4
- * For In Person Learning: Tape & Two Pieces of Paper to create "Democratic Party" and "Republican Party" corners
- * For Hybrid or Distance Learning: Instruct students to find red and blue objects
- * Answer Key

Instructions for In Person Learning

- 1. Prepare for the activity by writing "Democratic Party" and "Republican Party" each on one piece of paper. Tape each paper to different sides of the room, with enough space for students to move during the activity.
- 2. Use the <u>Google Slides</u> to either project each statement and read aloud to the class during the activity or use it to read aloud from your computer. Read each question or statement and give students 20-40 seconds to think and move to the correct political party sign. Once students have chosen which major political party they believe is the correct answer (Republican or Democrat) click on the presentation to show the answer. Discuss why the answer is the CORRECT answer and why the other political party is the incorrect answer before moving on. Call on a student to say why they chose this answer for critical thinking and to assist auditory learners.
- 3. Use the final slide to debrief and review the activity as a whole class. Pass out the Exit Slip and have students complete it before leaving class.

Instructions for Hybrid or Distance Learning

- 1. Prepare for the activity by having students gather two objects from their home: one red item and one blue item. These items will be used to represent the Republican Party (red) and the Democratic Party (blue).
- 2. Use the <u>Google Slides</u> to project each statement and read aloud each one to the class. Have students hold up their 'red' item or 'blue' item to signal which political party most identifies with the statement. Once students have chosen which major political party they believe is the correct answer (Republican or Democrat), click on the presentation to show the answer. Discuss why the answer is the CORRECT answer and why the other political party is the incorrect answer before moving on. Call on a student to say why they chose this answer for critical thinking and to assist auditory learners.
- 3. Use the final slide to debrief and review the activity as a whole class. Provide students with the Exit Slip and have them complete the handout to assess understanding of the benchmark.
